### From Kent Thompson, Director:

Heroes of the Fourth Turning is a dazzling, provocative play. It dares us to listen to perspectives that many of us in the audience will find abhorrent; however, if we do listen, we may learn something about those on the other side of the current political divide in this country.

At the beginning, the young adults seem almost familiar to us: they are revved up on whiskey, cocaine, and desire, and are ready and eager to lecture, argue, show off, and flirt. It takes us a while to figure out that these Millennials are very different—they are graduates of a Biblically-oriented Catholic college in western Wyoming, where they lived and learned within a bubble, separated from the "godlessness" of progressives born in the era of Obama. While they join in robust volleys of images and ideas, their words keep ending into insults and diatribes and we eventually realize they are complicated and complex individuals who have a shared history with each other. In a play that could be grim, we sometimes find them amusing and endearing in their earnestness.

The Fourth Turning is a controversial and disputed theory that posits that the world operates in 80-year cycles of generational growth, destruction and rebirth. It calls upon a new generation of "heroes" to rise up and save the world. These characters see themselves as potential heroes in the world, but what kind of heroes would they be?

Known widely for directing classics and new plays, he has been a vital advocate and developer of new plays. He created the Colorado New Play Summit, the Women's Voices Fund, Off-Center (for immersive, interactive theatrical experiences) and the Southern Writer's Project. Thompson has produced 48 world premieres that have subsequently been produced by dozens of theatres across the U.S., including at Playwrights Horizons, Goodman Theatre, South Coast Rep, Mark Taper Forum, Signature Theatre (New York), Victory Gardens, Old Globe and more. Favorite new plays include American Mariachi by José Cruz González, The Great Leap by Lauren Yee; The Book of Will by Lauren Gunderson; Benediction, Eventide & Plainsong by Eric Schmiedl based on the novels by Kent Haruf; The Legend of Georgia McBride by Matthew Lopez; Black Odyssey by Marcus Gardley; The Whale by Samuel D. Hunter; Lydia by Octavio Solis; 1001 by Jason Grote; and A Lesson Before Dying by Romulus Linney based on the novel by Ernest Gaines. Thompson has also served as a trustee and board president of Theatre Communications Group (national organization of American Theatre) for 8 years and has served on numerous peer panels. His book, Directing Professionally; A Practical Guide to Developing a Successful Career in Today's Theatre, is published by Bloomsbury/Methuen. He is married to actress Kathleen McCall.

Markas Henry (Scenic Design) is honored to be the Artist-in-Residence as Scenic Designer for Curious' entire 25th season. He is honored to be a Fellow of the College of Fellows of the American Theatre. Dick received his BA in Drama from the University of Northern Iowa and an MFA from the Yale School of Drama. He is a Member of the United Scenic Artists of America.
